

Our Saviour's Lutheran Church History

In 1956 new alter clothes were purchased, the sound system was rebuilt, air conditioning was put in the offices and flood lights in the tower were planned.

In 1957 the operating budget was \$50,000. Improvements made, were painting the hallway, adding new hymnals, getting coat hangers, projector for Sunday school, rectifiers for the organ, tower room finished so it can be used as a Sunday school room, fix the church lawn, new folding chairs for overflow and a new mimeograph.

In 1958 the Ole Skorseth house at 105 4th Street West was given to the church to be used as a parsonage. Plans were made to repair and remodel it at a cost not to exceed \$9,000. The red hymnals arrived in 1958. The balcony was carpeted and the church was painted.

The dedication of the new congregation took place on June 10, 1962 with a membership of 2,165. Summer services were at 8:00a.m. and 10:00a.m. On September 10, 1962 Pastor Reynold Tange from Luck, Wisconsin was installed. The organists were Delores Peterson and Viola Laabs. The congregation will participate in the prayer of the Church in the Lutheran Book of Worship. The bread during communion will be put in the communicants hand instead of in the mouth. Pastor Wesley Haugen came in January 1963. In January 1963 there were 2,152 baptized members and a class of 42 confirmands. Sunday average attending was 1,076. The oak Hamilton piano was bought for \$575.

In 1963, Pella doors were installed for dividing the Sunday school rooms in the dining room at a cost of \$8,797.
