*As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, “Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?” Acts 8:36*

This is one of my favorite stories of faith in the Bible. Phillip one of the early leaders of the church is moved by the Holy Spirit to go and talk to this Ethiopian Eunuch. He goes and finds the man reading Isaiah and they go on to have a long conversation where Phillip explains the scriptures and tells him about Jesus. Immediately following this testimony of who Christ is they come upon some water and the Ethiopian jumps at the chance to be baptized.

This is one of my favorite stories of faith because I love the enthusiasm shown by this man. He hears about the amazing gift God has given us, he hears about Jesus' love for all, and he jumps at the chance to join that family. He doesn't wait for Phillip to offer a baptism. He doesn't wait until someone declares him ready. He simply jumps out of his chariot and says let's do this!

The question he asks, “What is to prevent me from being baptized?” is a wonderful question. I love that the author of Acts makes no attempt to clarify who he is asking this question to. Is he talking to Phillip, is he asking himself, is it a rhetorical question? The author doesn't say and the question suddenly jumps off the page and attaches itself to the reader. What is to prevent us from being baptized? What is to prevent us from joining this family? The answer of course is nothing. However, like all good questions, this question only leads us to ask more questions. What is to prevent me from telling this story? What is to prevent me from sharing this love? What is to prevent me from letting the Holy Spirit guide me to places I never imagined? One of the great pleasures of working in a church is how often the Holy Spirit guides us as we are going about the day preparing for worship and ministering to the congregation.

The late Rev. William Sloan Coffin said this of faith, “first you jump, then you grow wings”. This Ethiopian man jumped and then he went back to his country and shared all that he had been told, the Christian Church in Ethiopia traces its beginnings back to this man.

I know in the past I have shared the story of my time as a student chaplain in a nursing home, on my first day right after I had arrived I was asked to come and pray with a grieving family whose father had just passed away. As I rode the elevator up to the floor I desperately tried to think of an appropriate prayer for when I got there, but my mind was a blank. Instead as I walked into the room I asked God to guide me, and when I opened my mouth words of comfort and mercy and grace came out. I jumped and let the Holy Spirit guide me.

So where in your life can you jump and let the Holy Spirit guide you? Can you make that jump to forgive someone who wronged you? Can you make that jump to forgive yourself? Can you make that jump and trust the Holy Spirit to lead you to the glory of God's love?

the July 12, 2023 Meeting***

The Council at Large of Our Saviour's Lutheran Church held its regular, monthly meeting on Wed., July 12, 2023. Vice President Mark Fokken called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. He led the council in The Lord's Prayer.

The minutes of the June meeting were read and approved.

There was a motion by Anderson and a second by Blackwelder to review the changes to the Staff Handbook as revised. The Council had been emailed the revisions with the major changes to include the terms of Administrative Pastor rather than Senior Administrative Pastor, the Executive Board to be changed to the Board of Trustees, and the addition of 2 holidays.

After considerable discussion, it was felt that more work and clarification is needed in the areas of employee classifications, hours and vacation times, and holidays. A question was also raised about the availability of job descriptions.

A motion followed by DeVos and was seconded by Grengs to table council action on approving the Staff Handbook until the August meeting. Motion approved.

The Board of Youth Education shared plans for Rally Sunday to be held on Sept. 10. They have many ideas including a dunk tank, carnival games, hot dogs, and fund raisers. Pastor Levi will communicate with the Presbyterian Church to coordinate time for the event. Suggestions were made to invite community support from the police officer and the fire chief. The Youth Board has also sent a survey to older youth to help with the events.

The Youth Board also expressed a need for help and resources to improve the Sunday School walls and carpet on the third floor. A note will be put in the bulletin to ask for help. There are also a number of outdated appliances and machines that need disposal, as well as some very small wooden chairs that could be possibly be sold.

A council member requested that discussion of a 75th Anniversary Celebration to be added to the August agenda.

Meeting adjourned at 8:02 pm.

concern is hidden debris that could be in the tall grass.

Discussion on the job duty handbook for mowing.

Recent heavy rains we have had water in the basement of the church. Mark is thinking we need to get some dirt put in to slope away from the windows.

Rick made a motion to adjourn the meeting, 2nd by Linda. Meeting adjourned at 20:42.

**HARP** — This multi-stringed musical instrument is associated with David, who played to soothe King Saul and later wrote many Psalms. The harp also represents praise music in general, as well as all the instruments people use to

glorify God (see Psalm 71:22). The idea that angels play harps comes from Revelation 14:2 ("And I heard a voice from heaven like the sound of ... harpists playing on their harps").



## When we least deserve love

"Love me when I least deserve it," says a Swedish proverb, "because that's when I really need it." My mom recounts how my 1-year-old sister, scooting around in a walker, somehow got hold of and spilled a loosely capped bottle of cooking oil. As Mom cleaned up, my sis scooted into the bathroom and unwound all the toilet paper.

Mom went to investigate the ruckus, and as she respooled the TP, my sister went back to the kitchen, pulled crackers out of a lower cupboard, tossed them on the floor and drove over them — in the remaining oil. At that point, Mom decided it was naptime! Yet I know Mom laid her little one in her crib with tender love. After a rest, they'd start afresh.

In John 21, the risen Jesus addresses Peter, who had denied him three times the night of Jesus' arrest. But Jesus didn't treat Peter harshly. In love, the Savior offered his disciple a fresh start. So too, when we're at our worst, hurting God's heart by hurting others and creation, God loves us all the more. He loves us into a fresh start — even, and especially, when we least deserve it.

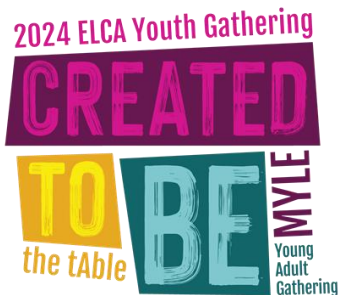
**Backpack Blessing:** — bring your backpack to church on **Sunday, September 10<sup>th</sup>** and have it blessed for the upcoming school year.

1. Preheat oven to 300°. In a mixing bowl, combine egg whites and vanilla. Whisk eggs with mixer at medium speed until frothy.
2. While whisking, gradually add sugar and cornstarch. Keep whisking at high speed until stiff peaks form.
3. Spoon mixture onto a baking sheet lined with parchment paper. Create fun shapes.
4. Bake 20 minutes. Cool and enjoy!
