"You are dust, and to dust you shall return" Gen 3:19

Soon it will be Ash Wednesday. A service and day that marks the beginning of Lent, and a reminder of our need for God's love. Another thing it "marks" is our forehead in one of my favorite visuals of Christianity. The ashes that we use for this service are from the palms used on Palm Sunday. Palms that were waved in representation of the celebration and excitement about Christ entering into the Holy Land, now turned to ash to represent cost of sin and Christ's death on the cross. Two seemingly completely different moods that are united by one universal truth, God's love. It is present in the joy and excitement, it is present in sadness and mourning, it marks our heads and follows us wherever life takes us.

I love going about town and seeing people with different variations of the cross marked on their forehead. I love the kids who have forgotten it was there and now have a smear of ash both on their forehead, and the back of their hand. I love the little smile when someone sees it and remembers what day it is. I love people who don't know what day it is and helpfully tell you, "Hey you have something on your forehead". I love how boldly it claims us as beloved children of God.

What is so beautiful about this act of placing ashes in the form of a cross on our foreheads, is that it makes such a stark visual representation of what we know to be true. When we were baptized we were sealed by the Holy Spirit, and marked with the cross of Christ forever. That cross, whether it is present in ash or not, is always there, a symbol of God's promise.

And here is the thing, **it never goes away.** It can't be washed away at the end of the night, or accidently knocked off when we itch our forehead, (as a kid I always knew that the second that ash hit my forehead I would have a sudden urge to scratch in that exact spot). That cross stays because that cross was not placed by man, it was placed by God, and no matter who we are, no matter what we are doing or have done, **that cross stays**.

So this Lent, long after the ash has disappeared, take a finger and trace it's outline on your forehead, and know that though you may not be able to see it, "Hey you have something on your forehead".

## Going out of our way

In mid-2022, Mediterranean Shipping Company, a world leader in container transport, voluntarily changed its routes, on the advice of scientists, to protect large populations of blue whales off the Sri Lankan coast. Going out of its way 15 nautical miles has led to a whopping 95% drop in whale strikes.


Jesus counseled people to go out of their way for one another, especially for the vulnerable: "If anyone would sue you and take your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. And if anyone forces you to go one mile, go with him two miles." Further, "whoever gives one of these little ones even a cup of cold water ... will by no means lose his reward" (Matthew 5:40-41; 10:42, ESV).

Paul likewise urged his listeners to voluntarily give up eating meat, even if they didn't believe in and weren't challenged by the idols to which it had been sacrificed, for the sake of new believers with weaker faith (Romans 14).

Faith calls us to go out of our way for the sake of others; sometimes a wealthy corporation opts to do the same. God's hand is at work in both, protecting vulnerable humans and nonhumans alike.
