Every other year for Lent we do the “Holden Evening Prayer” service. It is a beautiful musical service based on the “Vespers”, or “evening” prayer service. Each time we do this service I choose a theme to preach short sermons on. In the past we have worked our way through the sections in Luther’s Small Catechism related to the Lord’s Prayer, and Apostles Creed, last time we took a look at different famous men in the Bible and their struggles and triumphs. This year I have decided to dedicate each week of Lent to an introduction to the five books of the Pentateuch.

The Pentateuch or “Torah” are some of the most important books both in our faith and in the Jewish tradition. They encompass the beginning of creation up to the Jewish people entering the promised land. Within these five books we find the building blocks of understanding our relationship with God. Within these five books we find God’s gift of the Law, and the blessing of his promises.

Lent is a time of introspection and prayer and thus, I think it will be most valuable to us as a congregation to spend time learning the history and makeup of the books first designed to help us do those very things. We will begin our journey with the book of Genesis on March 1st, and each successive week will tackle a different book in the Pentateuch. I look forward to joining you on this journey.

Minutes of the February 8,  
2023 Meeting***

These are the minutes of the regular, monthly meeting of Our Saviour's Lutheran Church Council at Large for Feb. 8, 2023. President Dee Benson called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Pastor Levi led a prayer of thanks for the joys and gifts of service with the new council, and asked the Lord to walk with us in our mission.

A sign in sheet was passed for council member phones and email addresses.

President Benson welcomed the returning and new council members, and each person introduced himself.

There was no Old Business.

In New Business, Pastor Levi shared that his contract agreement with the Presbyterian Church is in progress, with the intent to begin on the first Sunday in March. Pastor Levi will be conducting services at the Presbyterian Church on Sundays after the services at Our Saviour's, allowing time for fellowship with OSL after the service. He will also conduct funerals, weddings, and hospital visits for the Presbyterians. The Presbyterian Church is in full communion with the ELCA. The beginning term will be a 6 mo. contract. Hopefully, OSL will also secure an intern, and Pastor Levi and Bruce Wornson will travel to Luther Seminary on Feb. 20 and 21 to meet potential candidates.

A question was raised about whether Presbyterian youth will be included in church activities. Pastor Levi feels that they should be invited to participate.

A suggestion was made to have the council review the Annual Meeting Minutes in February so that they are ready for approval by the congregation at the Annual Meeting the following January. It is easier to think of any additions or corrections that might be needed in a shorter time period than a year.

After discussion, the minutes will be reviewed by the council at the next meeting. It was also suggested that they might be published in the monthly newsletter following review by the council.

Pastor Levi will coordinate the installment of new council members at a church service.

Boards were instructed to name officers for each committee or office from each board including Chair, Vice President, Secretary, Stewardship Committee, and Personnel Committee, and those positions should be shared with the Council.

Motion and second to adjourn. Meeting adjourned at 7:12 pm.

Fairgrounds building-discussion that the window sills need to be replaced as they are rotting. Roof needs to

be replaced from wind storm in May 2022. It was decided to talk with WELCA about a collaborated effort on what should be done. It was also discussed that whatever was decided with WELCA to possibly have a discussion with Fair Board about options.

**Check Signers:** As newly appointed members of the Board of Trustees, Rick Olson and Kerri DeVos will need to be added as check signers on all bank accounts. It was decided that Mark Fokken should also be a check signer. Will need to remove Mike Weckwerth from all bank accounts.

Discussion was had on where money was invested for the church. Mark will bring forward to next meeting so newly appointment members know where all the investments are for the church.

3. Place a cucumber circle upright in the cream cheese to make a bug body.
4. Add the tomato as a head.
5. Arrange basil leaves on a plate and place the veggie bugs on them.
6. Making different-shaped bugs with your favorite veggies. Enjoy!
