The reason is because they represent an exciting new ministry outreach we will be starting soon here at Our Saviour’s. In the upcoming weeks you may begin to see signs for an event we are going to be calling “Theology on Tap”.

“Theology on Tap”, will be a once monthly get together that will be open to members of our church and the community at large. We will be meeting most likely on a Sunday evening over at Heroes to share in food, drinks, and lively conversations about faith, life, and the beautiful complexities of the gift of grace given to us by a loving God. All voices and life experiences will be welcome, whether you have been studying the Bible your entire life, or are completely new to questions of faith.

These type of events have been popping up throughout our Synod and the greater ELCA for the last couple of years, and have been very successful at bringing our church outside the sanctuary and into the community. However, this is definitely not a new idea, especially in the Lutheran tradition. A lot of the theology in the Book of Concord, the documents that lay out what Lutherans believe, came to be during conversations between Martin Luther and other early church leaders after a meal while they shared some of the beer that Katherine Luther had made.

So if you think this sounds like something you would be interested in, keep your eyes open for flyers that will be showing up around the town. And then join us for “Theology on Tap”.



Chairman Wornson welcomed new members, and each council member introduced himself.

The minutes from the January meeting were read and approved.

Pastor Levi asked new council members to sign a social network policy which requires the responsible use of social media.

Tammy Welker has agreed to participate on the audit committee. A motion was made and seconded to approve her appointment to the committee. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned, and the various boards retired to conduct their individual meetings.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES:

Board of Trustees minutes from February 7, 2018

Present: Rick Olsen, Curt Olsen, Bev Larsen, Mark Fokken, Bruce Wornson, Pastor Levi Bollerud.

Absent: Carol Gorder

Vice Chair Rick Olsen called the meeting to order at 7:45pm. Welcome to new members of the board Mark Fokken and Carol Gorder.

- I. **Approval of Minutes:** The minutes of the January 9th meeting were read. Motion made and seconded to approve the minutes. Motion carried.
- II. **Selection of Board Positions:** The board determined its representatives to various positions and committees. Bev Larsen will serve as Chair; Rick Olsen as Vice-Chair; Mark Fokken as Secretary; Stewardship and Personnel will wait until the next meeting.
- III. **Review/Payment of Outstanding Bills:** Outstanding bills were reviewed and discussed. Motion made and seconded to pay the outstanding bills from Jan 10th to Feb. 7th. Motion carried.
- IV. **NHS Bloodmobile in June:** Bruce Wornson shared that OSL has been approached by the National Honor Society (NHS) to have a blood drive in the fellowship hall in June. It would be one day only so a funeral, if needed, could be planned around it.
- V. **Parsonage:** At the annual meeting there was a recommendation to have the money from the parsonage kept secure in an account until such time as there would be a need to purchase another parsonage. The board has some discussion about where the money could be invested. This will continue to be investigated. With the congregational approval of the sale of the parsonage and Pastor Levi having moved, we also need to talk to someone about getting the property on the market. The suggestion was to ask Carol Gorder if Jon would be willing to list the home for us. We will likely have to do a walk-thru with the realtor to determine what needs to be done to get the property ready to put on the market. Arrangements will be made to have Jesse or someone else keep an eye on the parsonage while it is vacant.
- VI. **New Life Invoice:** The church has received an invoice for \$7,762.20 from New Life for the new wireless microphone system. Motion was made and seconded to pay this from the Lois Hansen Trust Fund. Carried.
- VII. **Organ Repair:** The organ needs repair and an estimate of \$2,400 has been received. Some of this will likely come from donations but a \$900 down payment must be paid before the repair can begin.

Motion made and seconded to pay this from the Music Memorial Fund. Carried.

- VIII. **Check Signers:** The board considered the official signatories on the church accounts. Curt Olsen will continue as a check signer. Motion made and seconded to authorize Bev Larsen, Curt Olsen and Treasurer Kathy Westphal as check signers for the General Fund, Memorial Account, Cemetery Account, TEAF Account and Safety Deposit Box at First Security Bank and remove Richard Kvols and Bob Welker as signatories on these accounts. Motion Carried.
- IX. **New Ministry:** Pastor Levi shared his desire to respond to a ministry opportunity in our community that exists among 20-40 year olds. His idea is to find unique ways to do evangelism with this population by bringing the church outside its walls. One ministry that has started to become transformative nationwide is to invite individuals to discuss their faith and the scripture over a beer at a local pub. This could work in Canby by doing a sort of faith event one Sunday evening every month over at Heroe's. It might be a bible study, discussion, faith building time, etc. "Bible and Brew" ministries are becoming quite popular these days and this is a way to reach out to new demographics. He cited the example of River of Hope Church in Hutchinson that actually started began as a new church through one of these events and it's still continuing to grow through this ministry.
- X. **LEAF Committee:** Rick Olsen inquired about the status of the LEAF committee and program in general. Bev Larsen reported that it has been some time since a loan was given out. She also shared a bit about the history of this program and for what purpose it was started. The board determined some investigation and possible reorganization of this program will need to be accomplished this year.
- XI. **New Video Streaming and Broadcast System:** Mark Fokken reported on the progress of the new video streaming system for the sanctuary. Video Magic Productions has secured a volume discount on the equipment that will save us nearly \$1,100 on the earlier estimate approved at the annual meeting. This brings the equipment cost for the project to \$12,155.00. Video Magic has submitted an invoice for this amount. Motion was made and seconded to pay this invoice for video streaming equipment costs from the undesignated memorial fund.

Motion Carried. The plan is to pay back at least half the cost of the system with fundraising. An additional invoice for installation and training will be submitted after the system is installed.

Motion made and seconded to adjourn. Motion carried. The board adjourned at 8:50pm.

Amber's Article

It will be 19 years ago on March 4th that my mom passed away. Sometimes it seems like it happened just yesterday and other times it seems like it was forever ago. She passed when she was just 60 years old. Everyone that has experienced a loss knows that there will always be those times that the pain is so intense and it feels that you will never recover from the loss and that you will never be the same person without your loved one. The world and time don't stop for us even though it feels that they should because it doesn't make sense that everything goes on without our loved one even though it feels like our world has stopped and will never be the same. At least this is how I felt.

I still miss her everyday but I am healing and now I treasure the memories that I have of her. My mom had such a great sense of humor and she smiled with her eyes. She had a gift for music and opened her heart and home to troubled teenage kids. I think those kids touched her life as much as she influenced theirs. For her funeral, we asked the “group home boys” to be the pall bearers and almost every one made it home to be there for “ma” as they called her, even though it was bad weather. One of the boys who was always rough on the outside but had a heart of gold pulled me aside and told me that he had worn jeans and t-shirts every day but he went out and bought nice new black jeans and a nice button down shirt because he wanted to look nice for “ma”. Of course, the “group home boys” were grown men and some of them already had families. It was so touching to see those nice young men there to honor my mom and even though some of them had tough exteriors, they all cried with us at the loss of “mom”. Mom brought us all together again

because all those kids were also her kids and she loved them and they knew it. From time to time, some of them still call and check in with us because we were family. I think my mom touched a lot of lives but most important, she was my mom and she loved me more than I will ever know. I will continue to miss her but I will also smile when I think of her and treasure every memory because her life was dedicated to her kids and those troubled teenagers who needed her and who became our family.
