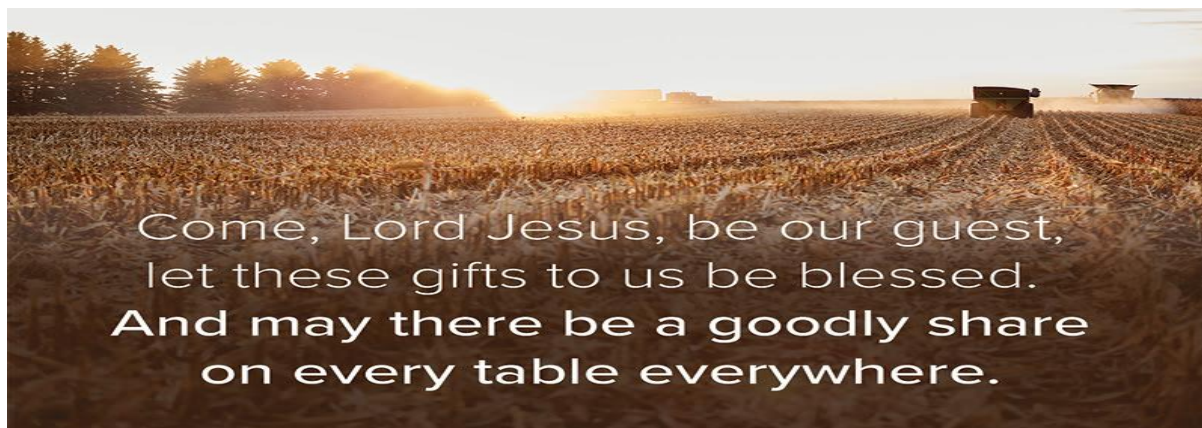

Many of us grew up praying “Come, Lord Jesus” as our table prayer, or grace, at mealtimes. Recently I learned this little prayer has a second verse that lifts our eyes from *our* table to the tables of others.

I am so grateful that serving in this ministry takes me out on the highways and county roads that stretch across the Southwestern Minnesota Synod. Our Saviour's Lutheran Church Council-at-Large Minutes of the November 8, 2023 Meeting

The Council at Large of Our Saviour's Lutheran Church held its regular, monthly meeting on Nov. 8, 2023.

President Dee Benson called the meeting to order at 7:04 pm.

Pastor Levi led a prayer to bless the work of stewardship in the hearts and minds of the council.

The minutes of the Oct. meeting were read and amended to read that rides to church will be available from Sylvan Place rather than Sylvan Court. The minutes were approved with the correction.

On Saturday, Dec. 2, our synod will be holding the Equipping Congregations Day at Vinje Lutheran Church in Willmar, MN, from 8:30am-3:00pm. Prof. Rolf Jacobson from Luther Seminary will be the keynote speaker, and there will be breakout seminars providing education on the life of the church. Pastor Levi encouraged council members to attend, and congregational members are also welcome. There is no registration deadline.

There were 4 Confirmation students in attendance at the council meeting.

Copies of the proposed Employee Handbook were given to council members to take home for review. The proposed revision includes lay and ordained staff and is based on a working document from another ELCA church. A suggestion was made to consider including the term Sick and Safe Leave in accordance with MN employment law, which includes mental health and safe travel as part of sick leave. It was also suggested that one or more persons might be called

on to make an emergency decision regarding an employee in the pastor's absence, or in other words, an acting administrator. The council will revisit the document again at a future date.

Cindy Maras and Sherri Grengs will serve on the Nominating Committee for council positions.

13 students and 4 adult chaperones are planning to attend the National Youth Gathering thus far. Plans are to fly.

Jeff Grengs, Trustees Chair, thanked the 75th Anniversary Committee and helpers for a successful celebration. Special thanks to Mark Fokken for his church history booklet and video presentation.

Motion and 2nd to adjourn. Meeting adjourned at 7:23 pm.

The board discussed budget for 2024 and did some preliminary budgeting for the remainder of the meeting.

Motion made by Kerri to adjourn; seconded by Linda. Motion Carried. The meeting was adjourned at 8:36PM.

Dutch Catholic priest and theologian Henri Nouwen found it useful to reflect on several questions at the end of the day: "Did I offer peace today? Did I bring a smile to someone's face? Did I say words of healing?" Pondering such questions may prove valuable at the end of a year as well: "How did I contribute to peace in the world this past year? Did I bring smiles to others' faces? Did I offer words of healing?" Nouwen continued, and we can too: "Did I let go of my anger and resentment? Did I forgive? Did I love?"

Many of us set New Year's resolutions for self-improvement, asking, "What are my goals? How can I better myself, my weight, my work-life balance, my habits?" But Nouwen said of his self-inquiry: "These are the real questions. I must trust that the little bit of love that I sow now will bear many fruits, here in this world and [in] the life to come." His resolution was to share God's love with others. With God's help, it can be ours as well, for each new day and each new year.



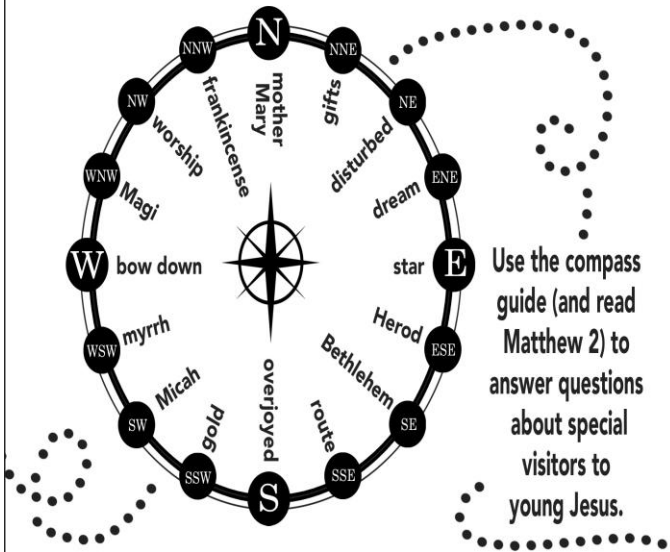






LIGHT-UP BOX

- A large clear plastic container and lid
- Green tissue paper
- Colorful beads



What you do:

1. Plug in the lights and place them in the container.

 - Cut tissue paper into triangles and arrange them in a tree shape. Decorate the tree with colorful beads.
