As I look back and reflect on this last year and our church one thing I was struck by was how full of life the church was this year. There was a constant buzz of excitement and curiosity this year that was notable. We have had many new wonderful families join us this year, but I wondered was there a noticeable difference in the day to day of our church. Therefore, I decided to do a little research and see if this feeling was backed up by the data, and it was.

In 2023 our average weekly attendance was 118 in 2024 it was 131 an 11% increase. We also had a growth in our online viewership with an average of almost 90 viewers of every livestream we made available in 2024. I would also like to note that some of those views more than likely included more than one person watching at a time, in addition we have no way of tracking those who watch on cable, so our weekly “online” worshippers could be much larger than we can accurately count. And from speaking with people throughout the year I can tell you that some of those online worshippers live across the country.

There is a buzz of excitement in this church, something special is happening, even the raw data backs that up. I don’t know about you, but I am eager to see what the future holds for us here at OSL.

Council-at-Large Minutes of
the December 11th, 2024
Meeting***

These are the minutes of the Jan. 8, 2025, Council at Large. Chair Benson called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. Pastor Levi led the council in a prayer of thanks for the work of the church and guidance for stewardship of the gifts God has provided.

The minutes of the Nov. 2024 meeting were read and corrected to show that two new Deacons Board members are needed on the council rather than one.

The 2025 proposed budget was distributed to council members. Mark Fokken spoke about the increased proposed budget that reflects changes to salaries and healthcare which for

the pastor are calculated through the ELCA Portico website reflecting years of experience and changing healthcare costs. The custodial and other staff budget portion reflects a 3% increase with added Social Security and FICA. There is also an additional \$6,000 for an Elementary Education Coordinator for Sunday School and Vacation Bible School. That calculation was based on 10hrs./wk at \$15/hr. for 40 weeks.

Savings were noted in the areas of fuel and electricity, especially where heat pump repairs have resulted in some better efficiency. Replacement of the church office furnace has also been beneficial. The property insurance plan changed as well. The Cornerstone Fund also provides a safety net for increased costs.

After discussion, a motion was made by Olsen to present the proposed budget of \$273,849.43 with no intern, and \$290,240.43 should OSL get an intern to the congregation for approval on Jan. 26, 2025, at the Annual Meeting following the 9:00 am church service. The motion was seconded by Appel. The motion was approved.

There is currently one applicant for the Elementary Education Coordinator position and more volunteers are needed for the Easter Breakfast Committee, especially someone to lead the committee.

Motion and second to adjourn. Meeting adjourned at 7:19pm.

Congregational Meeting Minutes

These are the minutes of the January 26, 2025, Annual Meeting for Our Saviour's Lutheran Church. President Dee Benson called the meeting to order at 10:08 am. A sign in sheet was distributed.

Pastor Levi led a prayer of thanks for the gifts, people, and talents of the church. He prayed for guidance of good work as stewards of these gifts.

The minutes of the 2024 Annual Meeting were read and approved.

Pastor's comments: Pastor Levi referred to the confirmations, baptisms, weddings and funerals as

listed in the Annual Report. He thanked the congregation for help establishing the Prayground. He also thanked the Organ Committee members for their time and research to choose and install the new organ. He commented on the church's gifts of good finances and good stewardship. Pastor has applied for an intern through Wartburg, and he hopes to know the outcome soon.

President's Report: President Benson thanked the council members: those remaining, and those going off the various boards and committees, as well as those who have expressed a willingness to serve. She also thanked Pastor Levi for his leadership.

Trustees' Report: Loren Hacker, Trustees Chair, thanked the many church volunteers, especially those who helped with the organ process; Dawn Ourada as Chair, Gary Olsen for help with electrical, Karen Olsen as organist, Mark Whittier, and other members. Some speakers still need to be installed and 10% of the payment will be made later after the completion of the installation. The Endowment Fund has grown about 5%, and giving has exceeded operating expenses of the church. The furnace and air conditioning costs have decreased, as have electrical and fuel costs. The fair kitchen building is an ongoing concern. Though there is a new air conditioner, the building structure is deteriorating. Repairs are needed on the church bell tower. The agreement with the Presbyterian Church for Pastor Levi's services has been \$6,000 per year. Church members are encouraged to ask Loren or other Trustees if they have any questions at all about church finances.

Mark Fokken referred the congregation to the the Cornerstone Fund and the ELCA Endowment in the Annual Report. The profits have been great to help expenses. He encouraged the congregation to help this growth more through estate planning, and he encouraged more coordinated discussion and planning with church leadership to occur.

President Benson directed attention to the other Board and Committee Reports as printed in the Annual Report.

There was no Old Business.

New Business: The annual budget has been reviewed and forwarded to the congregation for approval. Paper ballots were distributed. The ballot choices were as follows; Yes, including an intern, or No. The budget was approved, 43 Yes, 0 No.

President Benson read the slate of nominees for council, board, and committee positions. She asked 3 times for any additional nominees for each, but

there were none. A motion was made and seconded to cast a unanimous ballot for the slate of nominees. Motion carried.

Motion and second to adjourn. Meeting adjourned at 10:34 am.

Update on the new organ. It will soon be installed. The company is still waiting for 2 more speakers to be delivered. Then they will install everything.

The Personnel Committee will meet to discuss the applications for the Sunday School support position.

Loren discussed updating the "Simply Giving" cards. Will then place in the pews, reminders in the bulletins and find a way to reach out to those that do not live locally but still contribute to the church.

The Board of Trustees would like to thank Linda Blackwelder and Kerri DeVos for their time given to the church by being on the Board of Trustees. No new business to discuss.

Linda Blackwelder made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Kari Harding seconded the motion. Meeting adjourned at 8:00 pm.

- Colored felt
- Scrap paper
- Permanent marker
- Scissors
- String
- Essential oils (rose, lavender, etc.)



What you do:


1. Draw a flower shape on paper and cut it out.
2. Place the flower template on felt and draw around it with the marker.
3. Cut out the felt flower. Then cut a small slit or hole through it.
4. Cut 8 inches of string. Thread it through the felt flower and tie to form a loop for hanging.
5. To the felt, add 3 to 5 drops of essential oil. This air freshener will last about 2 weeks.
6. Revive the scent, as needed, by adding a few drops of essential oil.
