While Pastor Levi is on Sabbatical and we all find ourselves helping out a bit more to make sure things run the same as if he were here, I think now would be a great time to give some insight to some of the extra ways to help out here at OSL.

**Ushering:** Ushers run on a rotating schedule. Which means that you only have to usher for 3 months out of the year. The work isn’t hard, greet people as they come in, hand out bulletins, collect offering, let the row know when it’s their turn for Communion and check pews after church for items left behind and collect bulletins.

**Sunday School Teachers/Youth Helpers:** Did you know that we have well over 100 youth in our church, ranging from new babes to Seniors? This is our biggest area that is always looking for help. They are always in need of Sunday school teachers. We know this is a large commitment to be here every Sunday, for 9 months, with extra work in between. With more teachers/helpers we might be able to break up our time commitment into only serving on a rotational schedule. You don’t have to be a teacher, or even a parent of a child in Sunday school, if you are looking to learn more about the Bible yourself, this is a great way to start. Think of it as a Bible study for beginners. Who knows the kids might see or hear something in a different way than you see or hear it. It is growth for everyone involved.

VBS is always needing help, with decorating, taking on a small group of kids, planning, decorating, taking things down. Here is a few of the many things that they are involved with, within the church; Trick or Treating for the Hungry, to help feed our community, Easter Brunch, Lenten Soup Suppers, Confirmation, First Communion, 3<sup>rd</sup> Graders receive their Bibles, The Christmas Program, Vacation Bible School.

**Quilting:** The quilters are pretty awesome! They meet here in the Quilting Room, in the basement every 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday at 9:00am. Their quilting room is huge and they are always making/giving to others in need. If you don’t know how to sew, I’m willing to bet that there are squares that can be cut, fabric lined up to be sewn, fabric to be pinned, things to put away or things to distribute. Some things stay local, some get sent to other countries, but nothing goes to waste. They have a great time down there.... I hear the laughter upstairs most days they are there working.

**Bulletin Folders:** This is a small group of people who come in on Fridays to fold bulletins. This group rotates every other month throughout the year. They come in Friday mornings around 9:00am and they fold and stuff the bulletins. All of them come in on the last Friday of each month to help with getting the Visitor out in the mail.

There are plenty more ways to help out, but this is just a few and where we seem to fall a bit short. Please reach out if you would like more information, I’d be happy to help!

***Our Saviour's Lutheran Church  
Council-at-Large Minutes of  
the June 11<sup>th</sup>, 2025 Meeting***

Congregational President Mark Fokken called the meeting to order at 7:01 pm. Pastor Levi led the council in prayer. The minutes of the May meeting were read and approved.

A motion was made and seconded to acknowledge Daniel Norgaard as a new member at Our Saviour's. The motion was approved. Welcome Daniel!

Intern Preparations: Our Saviour's will have an intern, Katherine Mackenzie, for a year, beginning in September. Preparations will be made to support her spiritually, socially, and to meet her housing needs. Chairman Fokken has appointed the following individuals as members of an internship advisory group: Kari Harding, Mark Whittier, Krystal Schmitt, and Ann Olson, as a representative of the Presbyterian Church.

Some of the intern housing rental costs will be covered by the Presbyterian contribution for pastoral services, and utilities costs will also need to be considered. The intern will have the office next to Pastor Levi, and a computer monitor is needed.

Synod Assembly: Pastor Levi gave a Synod Assembly Report. Most of the business was accomplished through unanimous ballots. A resolution also was passed for the Synod to self-fund a loan for about \$240,000 for updates to the synod building. The funds will be provided by renting part of the unused space in the building to fund the cost of the loan. Caroline Lewis, a professor at Luther Seminary, was the main speaker.

Sunday School Room Improvement: Susan Norgaard, Youth Education Coordinator, discussed the need for ceiling and wall repair and preparation for painting in the large Sunday school room upstairs. The Trustees will access the needs and facilitate progress toward painting.

Vacation Bible School: VBS will be held on August 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup>. Please sign up by July 7<sup>th</sup> if possible. Jill Winters, Office Manager, shared the cost of a needed update tool for Facebook, Adobe Pro, which allows for sign up for youth and other events such as VBS online. The cost is \$29.99/one month, or 19.99/month for a year's commitment, and the costs will be discussed with the Trustees as well.

Fair Dining Sign-Up: There are sign-up sheets available on the bulletin board outside of the church office for working at the Fair Church Dining Hall, and sign up is also available on Facebook.

Confirmation Retreat: Pastor Levi will hold an overnight Confirmation Retreat for grades 7<sup>th</sup>-9<sup>th</sup> on August 22 at Shalom Hill Farms. He will provide an introduction to Martin Luther at the Confirmation kick-off retreat.

Motion and 2<sup>nd</sup> to adjourn. Meeting adjourned at 7:25 pm.

# SHOO fly!



Make this candle to keep uninvited insects from your outdoor summer meals.


**What you need:**

- Lime
- 10-20 whole cloves
- Birthday candle
- 4 toothpicks
- Adult help



**What you do:**

1. Have an adult slice the lime in half. Cut off the rounded end of one half so it can stand without rolling.
2. Insert 10 cloves into the cut sides of each half.
3. Stand the bottom half on a plate. Insert the candle in the center.
4. Insert the 4 toothpicks in the cut side of the bottom half. Then place the other half atop the toothpicks.
5. Before dinner, have an adult light the candle that's between the two lime halves. The flame's heat will warm the lime and create a smell that insects don't like.
6. Supervise the flame. Blow it out when it reaches the bottom lime.
