After spending the last 11 years living in farm country with all of you I have learned of the importance of preparing for, and investing in, the future. Countless hours spent trying to create an environment that will encourage the most growth. I bring this up because I wanted to take some time this month to share with you how we at Our Saviour’s are doing this very thing.

In July we will be sending 13 youth and 4 chaperones to New Orleans for the ELCA National Youth Gathering. An awesome event that takes place every three years. It is an opportunity for our youth to interact with youth from all over the country and to hear from some pretty interesting and diverse speakers. It is also a chance for them to see all of the great work the ELCA does around the world in the name of Christ.

Our youth have worked hard on fundraising for this trip, and their hard work has led to a significant portion of the cost of the trip being covered just through fundraising. The remainder of the cost of the trip has come from the interest we as a church earn off of our endowment fund. Our current endowment fund sits at \$281,222.66, in 2023 that earned us \$10,680 in interest. That interest helped any youth who wanted to go on this trip to do so without families worrying about how to make ends meet. It will continue to help kids go to camp this summer, and mission trips in the future without ever reducing the principle amount. As that principle grows so will the interest earned. If you have ever wanted to give to the church in a way that has a lasting impact and invests in the future, the endowment fund is an awesome way to do so.

I recently attended an event where the results of many years of research on some of the reasons why people become church leaders. One of the major indicators of a youth become a future leader in the church was participation in mission trips, national youth gatherings, or Bible camps. When we encourage and facilitate the participation of our youth in these life-changing events, we are truly creating an environment that will encourage the most growth. So let us continue to invest in our future, confident in the plans God has for us.

***Our Saviour's Lutheran Church
Council-at-Large Minutes of
the April 10, 2024 Meeting***

These are the minutes of the Council at Large of Our Saviour's Lutheran Church for May 8, 2024. Vice Chair Mark Fokken called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Pastor Levi led the council in a prayer of thanks for community and wisdom for stewardship.

The minutes of the April meeting were approved as read.

Pastor Levi has received information from the Universal church directory company about possible publication of a new OSL directory. Traditionally, Lifetouch has published church directories, but they are now solely doing school photos. Pastor suggested that the congregation might consider a new directory in 6 months to a year as the last one was published in 2016. The directory would be at no cost to the church. Each family would be given a free photo, and the cost for the directory is funded by extra photo orders.

The church would receive credits based on the number of families that participate which could be used for various extras for the congregation. One example is an app that would include a website directory, ability to stream, ability to send push notifications, and a tool for online giving.

Pastor Levi suggested that a committee could be formulated to spearhead the directory. A volunteer to lead the committee would be helpful. A comment was made that the Deacons Board had led the directory process in the past. It was also suggested that some families would welcome the opportunity to take a family photo. Another comment was made about the idea of a self-published, less formal directory with a submitted family photo and contact information which is updated each year as is done in some other churches. Some questions were asked about the current online giving program and what is the cost. It is a small percentage of the donations. Also, how long would the directory app be guaranteed to support the giving? Someone was concerned about the wisdom and legalities of sharing personal information, and whether there is a need to allow an opt in or opt out option. There is a lot to consider, and Pastor Levi would like the council to think carefully about it.

Pastor Levi also stated that an intern is not available from Wartburg Seminary this year. One of

the considerations is the more diverse ages of current seminary students. Several of the candidates are older and have families and part time jobs that are established in a particular location making it harder to intern far from home. Pastor said that he will try again to get an intern in the future.

Motion and second to adjourn. Meeting adjourned at 7:17 pm.

Window Well repair – Rick Olson was able to repair the window wells. Thank you for your time and labor to make the necessary repairs.

Sacristy door/roof issue – Flashing was installed as an ice barrier for the gutter. When the wind blows, it flops around. It's not loose and shouldn't fly off. Just is loud flapping around.

Kerri spoke to the Board of Trustees on the generosity of the congregation members and the successful fundraisers that have been held so far for the OSL Youth to be able to go to New Orleans for the Youth Gathering. The Youth Board has been putting a lot of sweat equity into our youth program and if shows! There are 2 more fundraisers being planned as a last hurrah to raise the last bit of funds for the trip. The youth gathering attendees will serve food at the Music on Monday events June 24th & July 8th from 5pm to 7pm.

Organ update – Loren Hacker and Karen Olsen are meeting with a representative from J.F. Nordlie sometime the middle of May in Brookings to discuss our current organ.

Rick Olson made a motion to adjourn the meeting, 2nd by Kari Harding. Meeting adjourned at 08:10pm..

Topics of Discussion-

FOR VBS: We had talked about having flyer/registration in mail to families by 5/31. Continued discussion of having youth lead "My Lighthouse" for music/parent program Discussed having glow sticks for each day - thoughts about getting a strobe light and/or black light/black light bulbs in lamps?? Previously discussed using glow paint on shirts (this will cover a craft for night 1). We'll need to get word out to all signed up to help to have a meeting 2 weeks prior to VBS and again 1 week prior. Having the two meetings will allow us to run through expectations

and allow youth to provide input on My Lighthouse and other activities. Also discussed having the youth lead the lessons as well versus having me talking at the kids (same voice they've been hearing all year ☺). We will need to finalize daily meals and figure out crafts and activities that will pair with the Bible verses for each day.

ONGOING YOUTH

FUNDRAISING/REQUIRMENTS: We had a lot of discussion about requiring youth to participate in fundraising activities and serving the congregation through things like Easter breakfast. Riece also made many good points that she wished she would have learned more and participated in more things while in confirmation. Would like to request a meeting with Pastor Levi to discuss all of this. Discussed bringing all ideas to the June meeting to create an agenda and then request Pastor Levi meet with us to discuss at the time of the July council meeting. We discovered several binders in the church office that outlined previous expectations for confirmation youth and youth in general that we could work off from.

YOUTH BOARD GUIDE/EXPENSES:

We should work off from the youth director guide (found in the office) to put together a revised binder of all things our board is responsible for. Also make a list of all things the youth fund is financially responsible for - recording dollar amounts so we know how much money we actually have left to work with that is allocated from the annual budget.

SUNDAY SCHOOL CURRICULUM:

We need to look for something else that is actually user friendly and all put together for us. OR - we can continue to use what we have been, but then I would ask that we divide and conquer and divide out the weeks between all of us where each person would be responsible for planning the same number of weeks - it's a lot and I just can't do it all again next year.

RALLY SUNDAY:

We did briefly discuss this at the May meeting. Discovered items that were used for a carnival in the past. I personally feel like a carnival is too big of an undertaking for us. However, we did discuss setting up a big corn hole tournament for Rally Sunday in addition to things we did last year like the dunk tank/pop bottle toss/ etc. Also someone brought up doing a "cake walk".

NEWSLETTER:

I will continue to prepare the youth newsletter. Questioned if it should continue to be sent out

weekly through the summer or only the week prior to scheduled events (such as the ELCA youth gathering fundraiser - food truck at Monday Music in the Park).

Our Father's arms

As a young boy, J. Ellsworth Kalas had to visit the Mayo Clinic for tests. His parents, knowing their son was safe in the hospital overnight, slept at a nearby hotel. But Kalas was so lonely and scared that a nurse called his folks. Kalas, who later became a pastor, recalled what it was like to have his father arrive.

"I remember his dressing me there in the darkness," he said. "Then I remember getting on a streetcar, sitting way at the back as we rode to the hotel. He held me very close to him, his long, ungainly arm wrapped around me. And the little boy who had been so frightened was now at peace."

We all face trials that can seem overwhelming. "How good, then, to draw deeply on the resources of God!" Kalas said. "In him there is a peace which is greater than the

trouble. How good, indeed, to burrow into a place of security, and to feel an arm wrapping strong about us and to know that it is the arm of our heavenly Father."
