For Lent this year we as a congregation will be using the Lenten series, “The People vs. Judas Iscariot”. This is not the first time that we have used this wonderful play to explore issues of sin and forgiveness, but in the past we have used a rotating cast of youth, this time we will have a mixture of youth and adults, and recurring actors. As we begin to take this journey again, I thought it would be good to hear the author Rev. Clayton McCord’s own words on his hopes for this Lenten drama series.

I have always wondered about the eternal fate of Judas Iscariot, the betrayer of Jesus. Was he beyond forgiveness? How is our sinfulness different? The story of his betrayal and confession holds in tension the judgement of God on one hand and the free grace of God on the other. In this tension I saw a connection to the theme of Lent: an honest accounting of our own guilt and need for salvation and renewal.

The goal of “The People vs. Judas Iscariot” is based upon the Ash Wednesday reading of Joel 2:13: “Return to the Lord, your God, for God is gracious and merciful; slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love...”. The series is guided by three objectives: 1) to revisit the passion narrative, hearing details through key witnesses in ways we might not have considered before now; 2) to prompt reflection upon our own need for forgiveness; and 3) to focus on the sacrificial death of Jesus Christ and his suffering for the sins of the world.

The purpose is to reflect on the justice of God’s law, exposing our sin, and the extent of God’s Grace through faith in Jesus Christ, by struggling with the case of “The People vs. Judas Iscariot”.

During these five weeks of the series, our members will be acting out different characters in the play. The “trial” is not meant to determine guilt, Judas has already been found guilty, but instead to determine the “punishment” for his crime. At the end of this Lenten series it will be up to you, the congregation, to make that determination yourself.

These are the Council at Large minutes for Wed., Dec. 13, 2023.

President Benson called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. The minutes of the Nov. meeting were read and approved.

Pastor Levi led the council in prayer.

Mark Fokken shared that the Sick and Safe Leave has been included in the proposed Employee Handbook. Full time and part time employees have been defined. There was a question regarding clarification of church office hours, and some further communication is needed. Approval of the Handbook will take place at a future meeting.

A motion was made and seconded to set the Annual Meeting date for Sunday, Jan. 28, 2024, following the service, with an alternate date of Feb. 4, in case of snow. The motion was approved.

The Nominating Committee has met to seek nominees for the January, 2024, elections. An idea was also proposed that an ex officio member on the Board of Youth Education would be helpful as the board is very busy, and more involvement is appreciated.

The council acknowledged the transfer of membership of Elois Shackelford to OSL Canby. Welcome, Elois.

Pastor Levi has suggested an idea for council consideration. On his trip to Oregon, he visited a church with bricks lining the walkway that were engraved with the names of loved ones who had passed. In a similar manner, OSL could offer members the chance to purchase an engraved brick. Some suggestions were to use the money as a fundraiser toward church repairs or updates such as the bell tower or organ fund. The bricks could be placed by the bench outdoors.

Progress on the Playground will take place after the holiday season.

The training for a bus driver to bring people from Sylvan Court will begin soon.

The Board of Youth Education thanked the congregation for supporting the students with the gift wrapping fundraiser and the Money Tree. The Bake Sale will be held Sunday.

Motion and 2nd to adjourn the meeting. Meeting adjourned at 7:31pm.

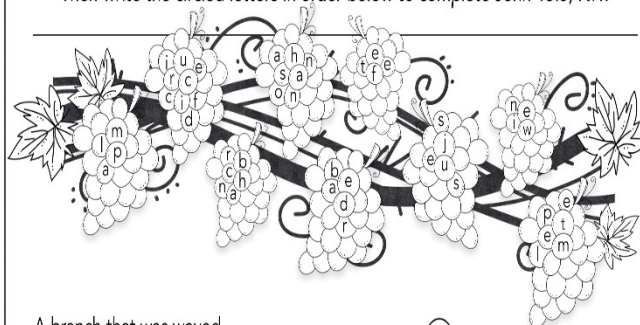

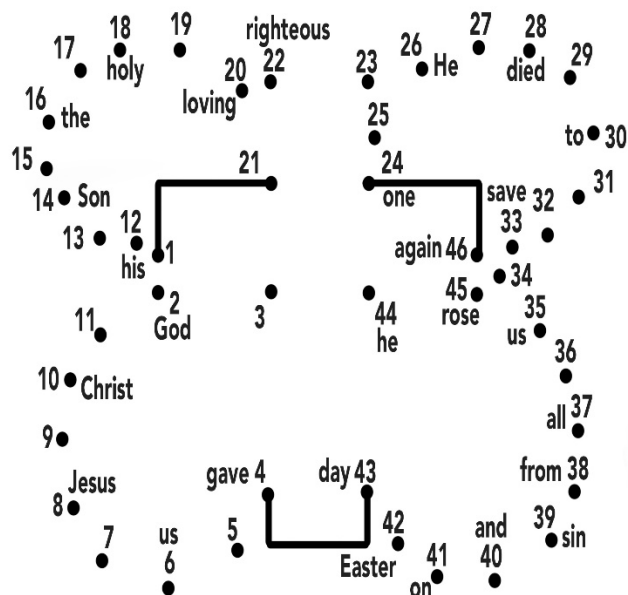

Try this chilly new take on a healthy snack.
