Hello everyone, I wanted to take a moment during this month’s article to talk to you about a recent uptick in scam attempts involving the church. I have been made aware that some of you have received text messages from a different number pretending to be me. These text messages follow a familiar pattern that was used in an email scam a few years ago. The scammer will pretend to be me and ask you to text back, when you do, they say that they are busy in a meeting but they need your help in providing assistance to someone in need. If you agree, they ask you to purchase visa gift cards or something similar and send them the numbers. If you receive a text or email like this, please know that it is not me and the person is attempting to steal money from you.

I want you to know that I will never text or email you asking your help in providing assistance. We have systems set up to provide assistance that allows for help to be provided but also tries to limit opportunities for it to be misused. If there ever comes, a time where there is a special assistance need that I would require a congregational member’s specific help please know that I would contact that member in person and explain everything. However, in the almost 13 years, that I have been here something like that has only happened a few times and never with money, (those were situations where the need was clothing, or bedding, or specific things like that).

A good rule of thumb is to double check the phone number or email that sent the message. I have had the same phone number for over 20 years, (701-367-7072), and I do not plan on changing. I also have not changed my email name ever either, (levibollerud@hotmail.com, or levibollerud@gmail.com). The church email is oslcanbymn@gmail.com. These are the ways that we would contact you. If you are ever contacted in any other way by someone claiming to be us, please check with us before proceeding any further.

One of the most important and vital missions we provide here at OSL is our care and assistance for those in need. That will never change, and by being good stewards of the gifts that God has given us, we can continue to care for all of God’s beloved children.

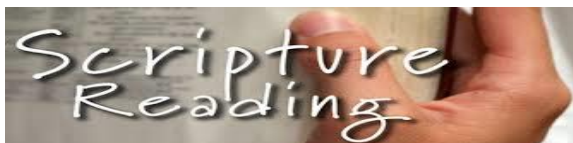

Council-at-Large Minutes of
the September 11th, 2024
Meeting***

The Council at Large of Our Saviour's Lutheran Church held its regular, monthly meeting on Wed., Sept. 11, 2024. President Dee Benson called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Pastor Levi led the council in prayer.

The minutes from the August meeting were read and approved.

A motion was made to acknowledge and welcome Susan Norgaard into membership. The motion was seconded and approved.

Pastor Levi discussed the need for an Elementary Education Coordinator. There is a need for lesson and supplies coordination for Sunday School and Vacation Bible School, likely a position of a few hours per week. The Board of Youth Education has many responsibilities that require consistent coordination, especially after the combining of two Boards, the Youth Board, and the Board of Education into one.

A job description with input from the Board of Youth Education and by the Personnel Committee would need to be developed. There are things to consider such as communication between the Education Coordinator and the Youth Board. Should he or she attend the monthly meetings with the board? Would the position involve coordination of the Christmas Program? Pastor Levi and the Board of Youth Education have been working together to create a vision for education throughout the grades.

Pastor Levi shared that vision with the council as follows:

Pre K through grade 2- Bible stories
Gr. 3 and 4- Bible stories with experience locating and reading stories in the Bible
Gr. 5 and 6- Curriculum that has been used at Released Time, including stories, questions, and the development of missions
Gr. 7 and 8 Confirmation education including developing and building one's personal faith
Gr. 9 Understanding Lutheran perspectives of faith
This vision was also shared with parents at Rally Sunday.

The Board of Youth Education also discussed ongoing record keeping challenges and feedback from parents regarding The National Youth Gathering and facilitating well chosen, focused fundraising efforts toward the next event. That way, younger youth and the parents can anticipate and work toward their trips in the future, knowing better in advance their financial responsibilities for the trip. Changing membership on the board makes this challenging, and the board will seek to provide recommendations and guidance for future boards.

Motion and second to adjourn. Meeting adjourned at 7:46 pm.

Tax Strategies for Gifts to the Church

As year-end approaches, congregation members are encouraged to be thoughtful about annual and future support for church operation. Two tax strategies many parishioners use to create greater leverage for their gifts are direct distributions from retirement accounts for those over age 70 ½ and farm operators giving grain to the church. Both of these provide the opportunity to make contributions without paying taxes. If you have taxable income, MN & Federal combined minimum income tax rates could result in 15.35% savings. Taxpayers in higher tax brackets would see greater advantage. Farmers would also realize a savings in self-employment taxes of 12.4% for FICA and 2.9% for Medicare. For seniors with higher incomes, these strategies could help avoid Medicare IRMA surcharges. Of course, it is each family's decision to pass those savings on to our church. Suggestions could include the OSL Endowment, a memorial, church operating expenses or a specific project such as the church organ fund. Please contact your tax advisor to make sure any of these suggestions might apply to your finances.

Sept. 22nd Church Organ Meeting Report

After the Sept. 22 9 am church service, thirty-five members of the congregation were present as Mark Whittier led a presentation from the Organ Committee about the need for the renovation / replacement of the church organ. The organ, purchased used in the 1950's, is in need of major renovation. Aadland Pipe Organ Company of Valley Springs SD provided an estimate of \$189,000 to renovate the pipe organ to basic playable condition. It is estimated the process could stretch out 2-3 years.

Organ committee members, Mark Whittier, Karen Olsen, & Helen Schultz, conducted a site visit to 1st Lutheran Church in Alexandria to examine, play and listen to a Viscount digital electronic organ. Committee members were impressed with the sound and abilities of the organ. A digital recording and short video of the Viscount organ was projected. Carlson Music Center of Alexandria, MN quoted a price of \$34,500 for the new organ. Installation would occur within weeks of payment.

Congregation members asked a number of questions:

Karen Olsen was asked for her opinion of the Viscount organ. She praised the organ's variety of options and overall sound. Her concerns included the sound of the bass and trumpets, better lighting and an assurance the organ sound would fill our large church. Her opinion was she was OK with either option but was leaning toward the new organ as long as the pipes remained.

Would the Aadland renovation have a warranty? Based on the long successful relationship with Art Aadland, the answer could be yes but one is not detailed in the proposal. The new Viscount organ would have a 10 yr. warranty.

Would the new organ be easier for future organists to play? Any piano player can play pipe organ with practice. The new organ's feature to play the bass line separately would make it easier.

What is the cost of a new pipe organ? Estimates would be in the high six figures or more.

Would the new organ have the ability to record and playback? Yes. (as would the renovated pipe organ) Both would also have the ability to transpose music.

Is there space and weight capacity in the choir loft for the installation of a new organ? Yes. The weight of the new organ would be 300 lbs.

What is the annual cost of tuning? The annual estimate for tuning the pipe organ would be \$700. The Viscount organ would not need annual tuning.

Will there be future organ technicians available to tune & repair the renovated pipe organ? Yes, Art Aadland has a number of assistants in training.

An anonymous member of the congregation has initiated a **\$10,000 donation** commitment to either organ option if matched by \$10,000 in contributions from other congregation members. Additional fundraising will be needed.

The Organ Committee will be meeting on Oct. 6th to make a recommendation to the Council at Large and Trustees meetings on Oct. 9th. Congregation members are encouraged to visit with one another and contact Organ Committee members, (Dawn Ourada, Mark Whittier, Karen Olsen, Helen Schultz, Mark Fokken, Jan Jerimiason, and Loren Hacker), with additional questions and input. The recommendation will exceed \$10,000 and will require a congregation vote.

Parable of the Pufflings

As summer ends on a remote island off Iceland, parent puffins — black and white seabirds with rainbow beaks — stop bringing fish to their chicks. These “pufflings,” whose first few weeks were lived in burrows in cliffs, now must launch into a wind current to glide

out over the sea and find their own food. Some babies, however, mistake a lit-up house or gas station for moonlight on the water and, as locals say, “fall out of the sky.” Because pufflings can’t yet take off from land and fly, if left alone they starve.

So for generations, during “puffling season” people on this island have stayed up late to rescue baby birds. On his *Animal* podcast, reporter Sam Anderson tells how, with an islander’s help, he picks up a puffling one night, placing it in a box for morning release over the ocean. As the frightened, confused bird squeals and scratches to get free, Anderson supposes it thinks this is the worst night of its life. In fact, it is the best: It’s being saved.

We humans often get confused, pulled in wrong directions. We’re misled and land in trouble from which we cannot save ourselves. Scared and confused, we believe we’re irredeemably trapped in the worst of circumstances. We can’t perceive that, even now, we are being protected and rescued, that God is working to give back to us the fullness of life we cannot attain for ourselves.

Hang on, beloved one. Though you can’t sense it at this moment, you are held in God’s care, soon to be lifted on the wind of the Holy Spirit, who will carry you into better days.
